POLICE – FIRE - EMS



The Milan Police Department handles numerous calls for service each day. It is the goal of the police department to provide the citizens of Milan with the highest quality and most efficient service possible. You can help us better serve the community as a whole by following these simple guidelines when calling the police department.

WHEN TO USE 9-1-1

- A crime that is currently in progress or has just occurred
- Whenever life or property are in immediate danger
- A medical emergency
- A fire
- Injury traffic accidents

When you dial 9-1-1, a highly trained Telecommunicator will answer your call. Although the telecommunicator is immediately provided with the address and phone number from which you are calling, you will be asked to verify this information. It is important that you remain calm and answer the telecommunicator's questions to the best of your ability. Remain on the phone until you are instructed to hang up.

There are times when you may be faced with a situation where police assistance is needed and you are not sure if dialing 9-1-1 is appropriate. An example of these types of calls would be, a car blocking your driveway, loud music, inquiries into Village services, or if your keys are locked in your vehicle. While these types of calls are important, dialing 9-1-1 would not be appropriate and doing so may result in the telecommunicator advising you to call back on the non-emergency line. If you have a non-emergency need for police assistance please call (309) 787-8520.
